**I am requesting this information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.**

**1. How many inpatient NHS services do you have in your local health board?**

Hafan Y Coed at Llandough Hospital

The Older People Unit at Llandough

A single ward at Barry Hospital

**2. What is the categorisation of these NHS inpatient services (e.g. open, locked rehabilitation, low, medium)**

Cardiff and Vale University Health Board (the UHB) have all of the mentioned inpatient services but in addition inpatient beds for older people with dementia, functional illnesses, detoxification and neuropsychiatry beds

**3. How many private-run inpatient services do you have in your local health board?**

The UHB have no private mental Health services

**4. How many third-sector run inpatient services do you in your local health board?**

The UHB have one unit with 4 crisis beds run in partnership with Gofal

**5. How many service-users were admitted to an NHS-run mental health inpatient facility? What type of service were they admitted too? (locked, low, medium)**

**6. How many service-users were admitted to a private-run mental health inpatient facility? What type of service were they admitted too? (locked, low, medium)**

**7. How many service-users were admitted to a third sector run mental health inpatient facility? What type of service were they admitted too? (locked, low, edium)**

None, the only 3<sup>rd</sup> sector facility the UHB use is Lindon House.

Patients stay there for a max of one week and it acts as an alternative to Hafan y Coed admission. Patient's admitted there are either experiencing or are being assessed for acute mental distress. It is an unlocked facility.

Cardiff and Vale own the building but it is staffed and run by Gofal Cymru (which is a 3<sup>rd</sup> sector provider).
