**Adult Mental Health Contacts - Accommodation Status**

**Request Details**

Please could you provide the data in a monthly breakdown for the following years:

01 January 2019 to 31 December 2019; 01 January 2020 to 31 December 2020; 01 January 2021 to latest available data.

- 1) The total number of people in contact with adult mental health services with accommodation statuses that indicate homelessness, such as rough sleeping, squatting, Night shelter/emergency hostel/Direct access hostel, sofa surfing, local authority temporary accommodation, staying with friends or family on a short term basis, or other homeless.
- 2) The number of nurses or support workers who support patients regarding their housing while they are inpatient in a mental health unit. These could be housing officers, housing support workers, special housing nurses, or similar professions that are specialised in housing support.
- 3) The number of nurses or support workers who support mental health patients regarding their housing while they are in the community. These could be housing officers, housing support workers, special housing nurses, or similar professions that are specialised in housing support.

This indicates the number of people listed as having 'no accommodation' in the system. 15 people who are current adult inpatients listed as 'No Fixed Address'. Their housing needs are listed in their care and treatment plans, and therefore they are supported by our Housing Support worker who works in inpatients.

Data is often incomplete, as people's accommodation may have been given up due to the need to go into placement, changes to family living arrangements or rental arrangements when in long-term hospital care.
