

<u>Freedom of Information Act 2000 - Request Reference Fol/22/169</u> Clinical Negligence Claims

I write regarding a Freedom of Information request on clinical negligence claims and would be grateful if you could answer the following questions:

- 1. The number of clinical negligence claims in 2019/20, 2020/21 and 2021/22:
 - 2019 108 claims.
 - 2020 65 claims
 - and, 2021 56 claims.
- 2. The number of clinical negligence claims settled in 2019/20, 2020/21 and 2021/22;

After considering your request, Cardiff and Vale University Health Board (the UHB) believes that Section 21 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 applies in this instance and is refusing your request. The reason for relying on this exemption is set out below.

Under Section 21 of the Act, an organisation does not have to respond to a request if the information being sought is reasonably accessible to the applicant by other means. The UHB has applied this exemption to your request as the information you are seeking is available in the public domain.
