**Theatres**

**1. Number of theatres at University Hospital of Wales**

Main Theatres have 15 theatres. Currently the specialities in each theatre are:

- 0 – Neuro
- 1 – Spines
- 2 – OMFS or Neuro or Ent
- 3 – UGI or Gen Surg
- 4 – LGI
- 5 – HPB or LGI
- 6 – Urgent cases of any speciality or emergency day cases
- 7 – Vascular
- 8 – Emergency theatre
- 9 – Emergency Theatre
- 10- Emergency Theatre/ Major Trauma
- 11 – Trauma
- 12 – Neuro
- 14 – Renal
- 15 – currently a red theatre

SSSU theatres have 8 theatres plus 2 temporary mobile Theatres: The mobile Vanguard theatres are for ophthalmology.

Other specialities are:

- 1 – Gynae
- 2 – Gynae or Ent or OMFS
- 3 – Ophthalmology
- 4 – Urology
- 5 – Urology
- 6 – Currently not in use
- 7 – General surgery/Endocrine
- 8 – Ophthalmology

CHfW has 6 theatres, only 5 in use:

- 1 – Trauma or Spines or ortho Paeds
- 2 – dental Paeds
- 3 – Emergencies/urgent and paediatric general surgery
- 4 – Paeds general or Paeds gastro
- 5 – not used
- 6 – Paeds ENT or Paeds ophthalmology

***Please be advised that these can change on a daily basis if there is an estates issue with the theatre and we are also currently looking at moving specialities around which we hope to do beginning of August***

Cardiff and Vale University Health Board (the UHB) does not hold this information. Under Section 16 of the FOIA, which provides us with the duty to advise and assist, the UHB can inform you that our specialities no longer use procedure packs.

**4. Please can you provide the name and email address of the procurement manager that would specifically procure consumable items for the trust**

After considering your request, Cardiff and Vale University health Board (the UHB) believes that the data requested is classed as personal data as defined under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and Data Protection Act 2018 and its disclosure would be contrary to the data protection principles and constitute unfair and unlawful processing in regard to Articles 5, 6, and 9 of GDPR. The UHB are therefore withholding this detail under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. This exemption is absolute and therefore there is no requirement to apply the public interest test.
