**Information Requested:** 

1. From when the FGM clinic in Cardiff opened, in May 2018. How many women have gone there every year since it opened. This can be done as May 2018 – to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018 – or it can be done on a financial year basis.

## 3. What treatment did they receive – i.e. counselling, corrective surgery, community advocacy support.

In 2018 and 2019 all women were offered Psychosexual counselling at the women's wellbeing clinic, funding for this service ceased in 2019. In 2020 and 2021 the clinic has referred women to 3<sup>rd</sup> sector agencies for support such as BAWSO, OASIS, the Birth partner project, the Orchid project, Red cross, Welsh refugee council and Trinity church. Future plans are in place to offer psychological support to prepare for birth at the women's wellbeing clinic.

Women with type 3 FGM or complex type 2 who are pregnant will be referred to the specialist obstetrician and offered de-infibulation in the maternity unit prior to the third trimester. Women who are not pregnant that are displaying any ongoing symptoms in relation to FGM are referred to a specialist gynaecologist within University Hospital Wales.

# 4. How many days was the clinic closed due to the pandemic. It is meant to be open every Wednesday.

The Women's wellbeing clinic has remained open throughout the pandemic, if the clinic has been unattended due to sickness or annual leave, all women have been contacted and an appointment rearranged for them to attend. The specialist midwife is contracted for 18.75 hours per week dedicated to this service.
