3. Number of moving and handling / safe patient handling facilitators for each clinical environment?

Cardiff and Vale University Health Board (the UHB) does not hold this information. Under Section 16 of the FOIA, which provides us with the duty to advise and assist, the UHB can inform you that all patient handling clinical staff receive patient handling training. In addition to this the UHB have recently implemented a Manual Handling Workplace Competency Assessment Programme whereby a signed off assessor can monitor staff training requirements in their areas and undertake competency assessments in line with set manual handling criteria.

Please note: The UHB no longer have access to the previous Datix system which is prior to March 2022, so this data has been collated from annual reports. To provide data within the cost of compliance the UHB have to allow for some filtering of the codes when searching. Whilst this is kept as broad as possible it does rely on relatively correct incident reporting and completion of the Datix record.

5. Average sickness absence cost including replacement staff?

Please note: that the indicated absence costs are an estimate of salary paid to staff absent through work-related musculoskeletal injury only. It is not possible to provide any indication of any replacement costs.

6. Number of litigation cases and associated settlement costs?

In completing a search for the information requested, Cardiff and Vale University Health Board (the UHB) has confirmed that this information is not centrally recorded or collated. To retrieve the information requested would require a manual search through individual records and the UHB considers that this would exceed the limit set within regulations for responding to a request. The UHB has therefore relied upon the Section 12 exemption ('Exemption where cost of compliance exceeds appropriate limit') of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and is refusing your request.





The UHB has estimated that to complete the work needed to respond to this request would exceed the time limit as set within regulations to respond to a Freedom of Information Act request. Under the Act there is an allowance of two and a half days, or 18 hours, to comply with a request and the cost limit set within the fees' regulations for this amount of work (18 hours) is £450 for the UHB. The fees regulations specify that the cost of complying with a request must be calculated at the rate of £25 per hour.

However, under Section 16 of the FOIA, which provides us with the duty to advise and assist, the UHB can inform you of the below:

• 2020 to 2021: **37 Cases Closed =** £326,055

• 2021 to 2022: **46 Cases Closed** = £1,092,986

2022 to 2023 to date: 43 Cases Closed = £521,479

Please note: The information above shows the costs of all Personal Injury Claims closed in the period and includes cases settled and defended.
