

**Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Request Reference FoI/24/425**  
**Older Adult Mental Health**

**1. How many Older Adult Mental Health Inpatient Wards do you operate?**

There are five wards in University Hospital Llandough (East 10, 12, 14, 16 and 18) and one Young Onset Dementia Ward (St Barruc) in Barry Hospital.

**2. How many beds are there on each Older Adult Mental Health Inpatient ward and in total?**

Each of the five wards has 14 beds. St Barruc has 14 beds, plus a respite bed used on a booking basis. In total, 84 beds plus 1 respite bed.

**3. What are the clinical cohorts for each ward: Functional Mental Health conditions? Organic Conditions (dementia)? Or Mixed Functional/Dementia Wards? Or other configuration? And if so, what? (ie are they single clinical cohorts, mixed cohorts or other, if other what configuration?)**

- East 10 is male dementia.
- East 12 is mixed gender dementia.
- East 14 is female dementia.
- East 16 is female dementia.
- East 18 is functional mental health.
- St Barruc is young onset dementia.

**4. If a functionally ill older adult needs admission, do they go to an older age mental health specific ward or to another configuration, and if so, what?**

Functional patients are admitted to East 18. On occasions where East 18 is full, female patients can be admitted to East 16 after careful assessment. We would also look to Hafan y Coed if there was no capacity at all in University Hospital Llandough.
