

Overview

Cardiff and Vale University Health Board (UHB) provides healthcare services to a local population of approximately 475,000 people living in Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan. In addition we also provide specialist healthcare services to patients from other areas of England and Wales. The UHB has responsibility for health promotion and public health functions as well as the provision of local primary care services (GP practices, dentists, optometrists and community pharmacists) and the running of hospitals, health Centre's, community health teams and mental health services. The UHB spends over £1.2 billion each year in delivering these diverse services and employs approximately 14,000 staff.

The UHB operates a number of sites across Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan, including:

- University Hospital of Wales (UHW), Cardiff
- University Hospital Llandough, Cardiff
- Noah's Ark Children's Hospital for Wales, Cardiff (co-located on UHW site)
- University Dental Hospital, Cardiff (co-located on UHW site)
- Barry Hospital
- St David's Hospital
- Cardiff Royal Infirmary

These sites provide a mix of acute and community services and are further supported by 17 Health Centre's across the area. Primary Care Services are mainly provided by contractors and include 66 GP Practices, 70 Dental Practices, 68 Optometrists, and 107 Community Pharmacies.
