Dear Colleague,

Since the first vaccines were administered this time last week, we have successfully managed to deliver the COVID-19 vaccine to nearly 1000 members of front-line and care home staff. I want to echo my comments last week thanking all the members of staff and partners who have allowed for us to be in this promising position. However, as cases continue to rapidly rise in Wales, I have to be clear that this vaccine does not allow us to be complacent; we must continue to keep each other safe by following the regulations.

Covid rates are rising steeply across our communities. Our staff and services are already under extreme pressure. In the run up to Christmas, we must resist the temptation to cast aside the regulations in favour of meeting up with friends and doing things such as Christmas shopping. On behalf of everyone working hard on the frontline, who are still seeing the dreadful effects of COVID-19, I am pleading with you to stay home as much as possible and delay socialising with your friends and loved ones until it is safe to do so, as right now it is not. We are very concerned that our primary care and hospital services are now under sustained pressure due to Covid, and sadly the number of people who we are getting very unwell is increasing. Unfortunately, we are likely to see that translate through into more deaths too.

Your actions this Christmas could determine who's around the dinner table next Christmas. So please consider doing whatever Christmas shopping you can online and socialise with friends virtually. If you have to go to the shops, please do not meet up with friends to do so, avoid car sharing, sanitise your hands regularly, wear your mask and keep a two-metre distance from others.

If you develop symptoms of COVID-19 (a cough, temperature, or loss/change in taste or smell), or if anyone you live with develops symptoms, or if you are contacted by Test, Trace, Protect (TTP) and told to self-isolate, then you must self-isolate. Do not dismiss your symptoms as simply a common cold. If those you live with have symptoms, do not think that you being asymptomatic means you can go out; it does not. Please do not attend your place of work if you are symptomatic or have been advised to isolate and do not ignore the instructions of the TTP contract tracers; they are public health professionals there to protect you and others.

Take part in the PRINCIPLE COVID-19 Trial

Alongside GP practices across the UK, we're recruiting people aged 65 and above, and those aged between 50 and 64 with underlying health conditions, to take part in the PRINCIPLE clinical trial that is evaluating the effectiveness of already widely-used drugs in treating those who are at higher risk of complications from COVID-19.

The availability of a COVID-19 vaccine has been a significant step forward that gives us great cause for hope, but there remains a clear need for continued research to identify further effective treatments for the disease.

The NHS remains under significant pressure and with COVID-19 cases once again escalating in Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan, studies like the PRINCIPLE Trial could help to add further effective tools reduce the impact of COVID-19 on our population, relieve pressure on our hospitals, and save lives.

If you have had symptoms of COVID-19 in the past 14 days and are either aged above 65, or between 50 and 64 with underlying health conditions, I would urge you to please consider taking part in the trial. Nursing Times Award for ChatHealth Messaging

I'd like to offer my heartfelt congratulations to the School Nursing Team who have recently been joining in the celebrations for a Nursing Times award for the ChatHealth initiative, which was launched in Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan in 2019. ChatHealth is a means for young people to reach trusted healthcare advice and support which has been developed and supported by Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust since 2013. ChatHealth has been implemented by more than 50 NHS Trusts and healthcare organisations across the country for use across a variety of healthcare services.

Evidence has shown that young people in particular like the fact that ChatHealth enables them to make discreet contact with health professionals 'behind a screen' while busy parents value its convenience.

Following a ChatHealth conversation, one young person commented: "I love that it's anonymous and that it's a texting service. That means you can openly talk about your problems freely without feeling nervous."

ChatHealth Project Lead Sandra Dredge at Cardiff and Vale University Health Board said: "We are delighted to share in the celebrations for ChatHealth winning a Nursing Times Award. It is such a great service for young people to reach out and get in touch with their school nurse anonymously if they have any problems or issues affecting them."
