Dear Colleague,

I hope you're keeping yourselves well. We may feel daunted as we collectively face the prospect of the two-week firebreak lockdown, which was announced on Monday (19th October) by First Minister Mark Drakeford. However, I am sure that you will agree with me that it is a necessary sacrifice which we must all make in order to get back in control of this virus. The firebreak will see a return to restrictions similar to those we experienced in March and April of this year, and I would implore everyone reading to familiarise yourself with them now in order to be ready to follow them from 6pm this Friday.

You can find the latest COVID updates including all of the regulations as part of the Firebreak lockdown, as well as Frequently Asked Questions, on the Welsh Government website.

We have created a simple one-page breakdown of what the new lockdown regulations mean for Cardiff and Vale UHB staff, which you can access here. From the introduction of the firebreak until the 9th November, you must stay at home except for exercise or essential journeys, you must work from home wherever possible, and you must not meet with anyone who does not live you either indoors or outdoors. This national guidance will supersede the local lockdown guidance on a national level and there will be further announcements from the Welsh Government about what we can expect afterwards.

Please do not treat this week as a last hurrah before the firebreak; continue to follow the current regulations and guidance, and help the staff at Cardiff and Vale UHB, who have been there for you throughout this pandemic, to continue to provide the best possible care in these extremely challenging circumstances.

COVID-19 Testing for Healthcare Key Workers

It is important that we remain aware of the symptoms of COVID-19, how to spot them in ourselves and others, and what to do when we see them. The most common symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- A high temperature
- A new and persistent cough
- A loss or change of taste or smell

If you have any of these symptoms, you and members of your household should stay at home. **Most importantly, you must book a COVID-19 test.** As a critical workers, staff of Cardiff and Vale UHB can access testing directly via the Health Board.

Symptomatic healthcare key workers (or householder members) should not book a test online. Just speak to your line manager who can arrange a test for you.

Members of the public can book a test via the Welsh Government online portal. This can be <u>found here</u> or by searching COVID testing online.

Please ensure that the Infection Prevention and Control team are notified if a member of staff receives a positive test result for COVID-19 by emailing IPC.CAV@wales.nhs.uk. Please also notify the Health Board's TTP team by emailing Covidstaff.Ttp@wales.nhs.uk



Staff Wellbeing during COVID-19


