We have seen the devastating consequences of this virus so much already and many of us have lost someone to it or know someone who has been affected by it. Last week, we held a *Time to Reflect* service, and launched our reflection wall for 2020, which you can see here. I hope to do more in the near future so please join me at the next one if you are able.

As I have written repeatedly, your actions this Christmas could determine who is around the table for Christmases to come.

Vaccination Update

Our COVID 19 vaccination programme is going well so far and as of Sunday evening we had delivered 3069 vaccines to front line and care home staff.

We are receiving enquiries from members of the public to ask when they will be eligible and I just want to please ask that people are patient while we plan this programme. Our current priority cohorts are frontline healthcare staff and care home staff, and we are also prioritising care home residents and over 80s as per national guidance. Members of the public under this criteria will receive a letter inviting them to contact our booking centre to book an appointment so please wait until you receive this letter. We only have small quantities of the vaccination at the moment and so can only offer appointments based on what we have each week.

At present we are only able to offer appointments at one of our vaccination centres but we are working towards opening our other centres and being able to vaccinate in care homes and other vulnerable people at home through mobile vaccination teams. We will keep you updated when these are ready to go.

Christmas gifts

It's that time of year when patients often show their gratitude for staff through giving gifts. Receiving a bunch of flowers, a box of chocolates or some biscuits is always a great feeling, but this year we must be very wary of also passing on COVID-19.

Our employees have given so much this year and are fully deserving of these tokens of appreciation, but with recorded cases of Covid-19 across Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan at record highs and our health service under critical pressure, preventing the transmission of the virus must be our priority. The best gift that the community can give to our staff this Christmas is simply doing everything they can to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.

I would urge those who would like to give a gift to keep social interaction to a minimum, wash their hands, maintain a safe two-metre distance and wear a face covering when needed.

People may also want to consider making an online donation to Cardiff & Vale Health Charity, which helps to provide rest and recuperation areas, refreshment facilities and other enhancements that make areas more comfortable for staff, and supports initiatives for the wellbeing of our staff. 
Executive Team changes

Working from home

The Digital Health & Intelligence Team are continuing to enable as many staff to work from home as possible, which was a theme that came up in my live Q&A session on Monday. A significant step forward in progressing this is the tireless work the team is doing to make Office 365 available to all staff. Microsoft Teams has been available for some time now, but the intention has always been for this to be part of the full Office 365 suite.

In the past few days, more than 4,000 members of staff have been moved onto the full Office 365 product, and a further 1,800 are being moved in the next couple of days. All remaining 8,000 staff will be moved to O365 by 21st January. You'll receive an email to confirm that your 'move' to Office 365 is complete, which will include links to guides that show you how to get started with using email and your calendar on your smartphone and mobile devices.

In addition, you will be able to log in to Office 365 on your home PC, and this will enable you to use Outlook, Word, Excel, PowerPoint as well as new applications like SharePoint and One Note. You'll also have cloud-based storage in your own NHS Wales 'One Drive'.

In the New Year, we hope to be able to use some of the authentication and security functions in O365 to enable staff to securely access clinical applications such as the Welsh Clinical Portal or CAV Portal from their personal devices. In the meantime this requires the use of the remote desktop function on a Cardiff and Vale UHB laptop, or to use the apps in Blackberry Good which many staff can still access.

Video Consultations

One of the major developments we've seen in 2020 has been the introduction of videos consultations, which have really been embraced by both patients and staff.

The NHS Wales Video Consultation Service has not only provided a valuable, safe option for continuing to see our patients face-to-face throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, but it has also given patients greater flexibility in how they attend their appointment, reduced traffic in and around our sites, and delivered significant environmental benefits locally.

Since we launched the service in April, we have conducted around 15,000 consultations by video, which we estimate has prevented in excess of 150,000 miles of travel to hospital for our patients. It adds up to around 41 tonnes of CO2 emissions having been avoided in and around local hospitals.

Providing care closer to home. We are continuously looking to develop and improve the service for our patients and staff, and have recently published guidance for staff on how they can effectively use the service from their homes, which is available on the <u>Attend Anywhere pages on the intranet.</u>



Welsh Clinical Portal App

The Welsh Clinical Portal (WCP) Mobile App, developed by NWIS has been live across the Health Board since July 2020 for all Junior Doctors and Consultants. Since this time, the app has also been made available to both Pharmacists and Nurse Specialists. At the moment, we are the biggest users of this App in Wales. Over 329 Cardiff and Vale staff are benefitting from functionality including:

- Diagnostic result visibility
- Dashboard 'My View' including count of Referrals, Inpatient Discharge Letters awaiting signoff (where applicable) & Results for signoff (where applicable)
- Patient search,
- Clinician, Specialty, Ward inpatient and outpatient lists,
- · Patient to-do lists.
- Patient handover text.
