I am so proud of the monumental effort of everyone involved in the COVID-19 mass vaccination campaign. We are making good progress and have, as of yesterday, vaccinated 41,790 people in the priority cohorts 1-4 as set by JCVI. We are on target to complete these by mid-February if we continue to receive a good supply of the vaccine.

As of last week, we have now completed vaccinating 69 adult care homes and are on track to complete all adult care homes in Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan by the end of this week, if not sooner. Second dose appointment have already been scheduled and soon all residents and staff will have had both jabs.

We have vaccinated all of our in-patients staying in our Mental Health Services for Older People Wards. Our GP partners have also been vaccinating the 80-and-over citizens of Cardiff and Vale UHB and all of our GP practices are now involved in the vaccination programme. Over the next few weeks, people aged 75-79 will start to receive appointments at their GP practice once the over-80s have been completed. People aged 70-74 will now start to receive auto scheduled appointments to attend one of our Mass Vaccination Centres. If you are aged 70 – 74, you will receive a letter and SMS from the Health Board confirming the details of your appointment.

If you're clinically vulnerable and aged 75-79, you'll receive your vaccination at your GP practice. The practice will contact you detailing your appointment. People aged 74 and under who are clinically vulnerable will be automatically be booked in at a Mass Vaccination Centre and contacted by the Health Board with the details.

However, if you're housebound, you'll be contacted by the Health Board and the Mobile Vaccination team will deliver your vaccine for you.

We are making such exciting progress but I must ask you to be patient if you are waiting for your vaccine. The number for the booking centre being shared on social media is putting a lot of strain on our team, which is working as quickly as they possibly can. Appointments are being automatically scheduled and letters are on the way so please do not call the booking centre or your GP demanding a vaccine.

I also must remind you that having the vaccine does not exempt you from COVID regulations such as wearing a mask and practicing social distancing so please continue to do these basic things to keep yourself and others safe.
